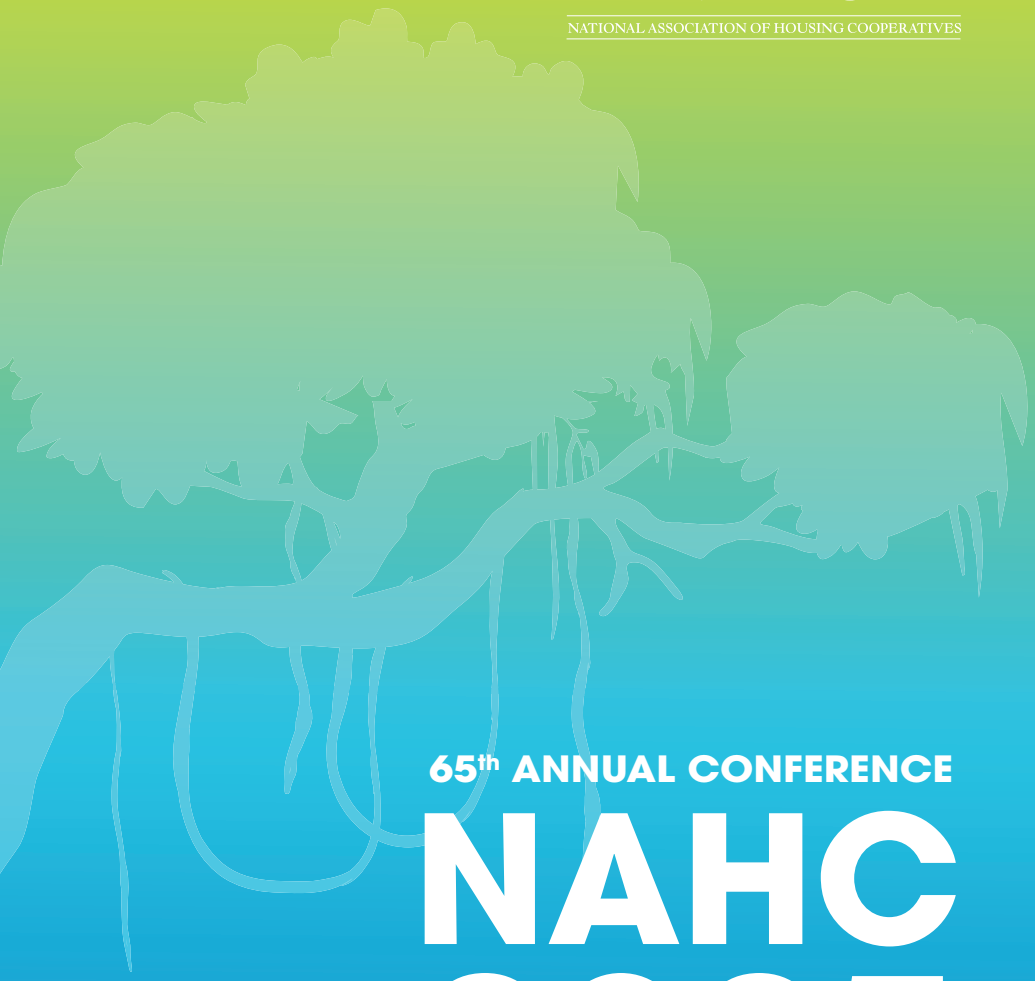

Cornelius Blanding

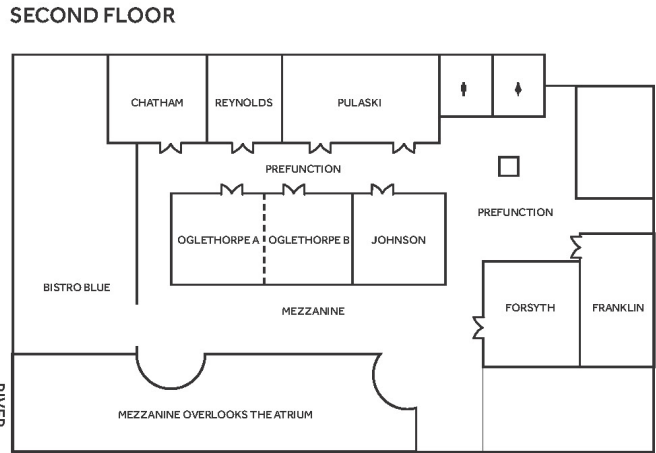
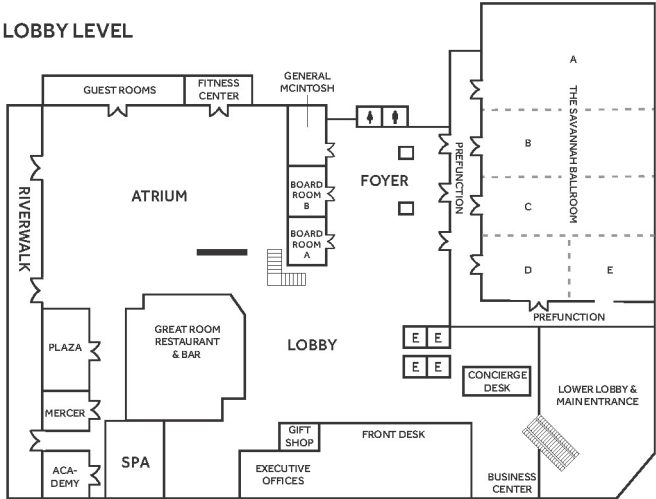
Executive Director of the Federation of Southern Cooperatives/Land Assistance Fund

Join us for this exciting keynote at the General Session on Thursday at 8:30 am.

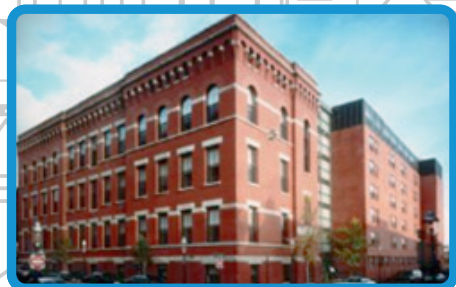
Hotel Floor Plan

Badges and Admittance

Official NAHC Annual Conference **badges must be worn at all conference events**, including the reception, luncheons, and sessions. Note: For your safety, we recommend not wearing your conference badges outside of the hotel when you are not attending a conference-sponsored function.

Tickets

Spouses, children, and other guests must purchase tickets in advance to attend either the Opening Reception on Wednesday, the Luncheon on Thursday or the Strut Your Stuff: Cooperative Pride Luncheon on Friday during the NAHC Conference. Tickets can be purchased at the registration desk and collected upon entering the function. Tickets for the Opening Reception on Wednesday evening are \$85.00, and luncheons on Thursday and Friday are \$95.00 each.

Annual Meeting of Members

NAHC will hold its Annual Members Meeting on Saturday, October 25, at 9:30 a.m. All members are invited to attend. Please be advised that most cooperatives are members of NAHC through a Regional Member Association, such as MAHC, CNYC, FNYHC, etc., and do not have a vote separate from the vote of the Regional Member Association. Voting at the annual meeting is only by 1) the Member Associations or 2) cooperatives, individuals and professionals who pay their NAHC dues directly to NAHC. Ballots are available for pickup on Friday, October 24, between 5:00 p.m. - 6:00 p.m. and Saturday, October 25, between 8:30 a.m. - 9:30 a.m.

Regional Association Members and Direct Member Association Caucuses

Regional Association Member and Direct Member Caucuses will meet on Friday, October 24, from 5:45 p.m. - 6:30 p.m. to learn more about the candidates who are running for the board.

Remember that if you pay your membership dues through a Regional Association Member, CAHC, CHANE, CSI, CNYC, MAHC, PAHC, NJFHC, you do not have a separate vote from your Regional Association. There is also an opportunity for Direct Members to choose to caucus. Direct Members may also use this forum to network, engage or bring other association- related business up for discussion. About the National Association of Housing Cooperatives Award Categories

Cooperative Star Award

The Cooperative Star Program recognizes housing cooperatives that demonstrate sound leadership, management, and housing value for their members and have systems in place to assure prudent preservation of their members' interests.

Distinguished Service Award

The Distinguished Service Award recognizes outstanding service to cooperative housing. It recognizes the achievement and contribution of a cooperative member who assisted a cooperative or association of cooperatives to better serve its members.

Gregory J. Carlson Development and Preservation Award

Recognizes an individual, organization, association or business that displays innovation, creativity, breakthroughs, leadership or business judgment that improves the likelihood and volume of successful cooperative development or the long-term viability of existing cooperatives.

The Alfred Reynolds Development and Preservation Lifetime Achievement Award

recognizes an individual who is a dedicated, life-long advocate for cooperative housing and shows devotion to the values of NAHC. This individual has demonstrated leadership, talent, and selfless effort to housing cooperatives while creating significant, positive, long-lasting change for cooperative development and preservation.

Jerry Voorhis Award

NAHC's Board created this lifetime achievement award in memory of its namesake and a man regarded as NAHC's founding father. The Jerry Voorhis Award is NAHC's highest honor, recognizing significant leadership in both theory and practice. Jerry Voorhis, a man of impeccable integrity, believed in, and did his best to teach, apply and widen the use of basic cooperative principles.

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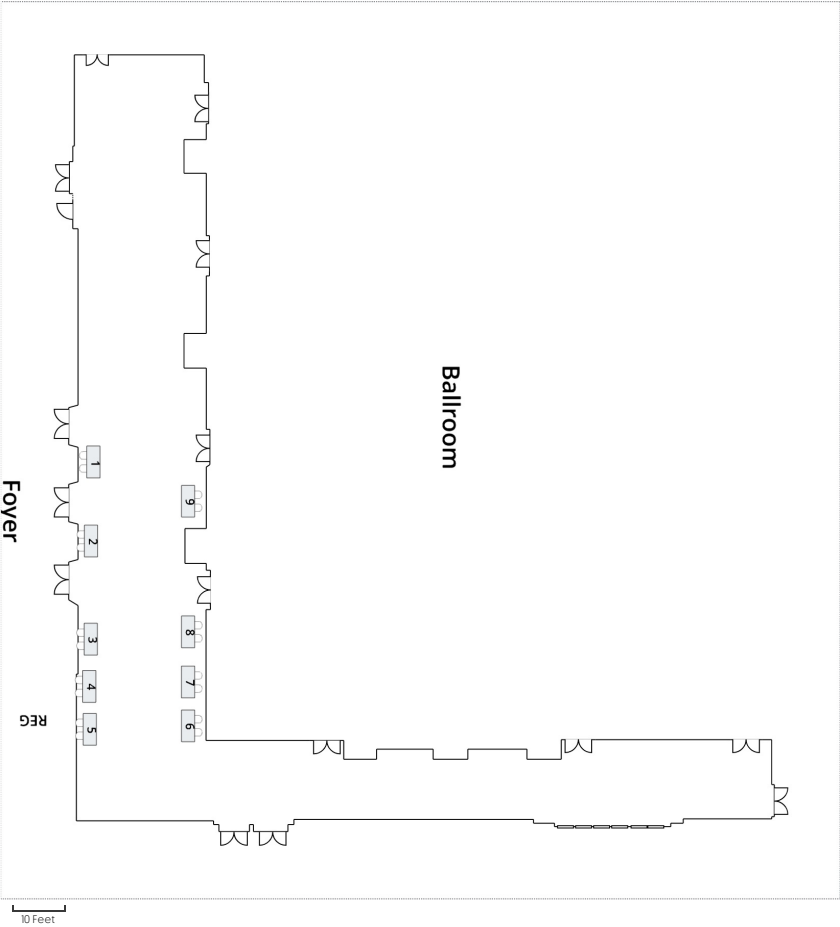
